Supporting Students with special needs in the classroom

Every child has the right to the same opportunities as others, regardless of the difficulties they face. According to UNICEF, about 93 million children around the world have been diagnosed with some form of disability. Over 50% of that number does not attend school at all, which robs them of the right to a better life. Aware of the importance of special education, countries around the world have developed different systems aimed at improving child care, education, and the quality of life in general.

A quality and well-designed learning disability education positively impacts the child's psychological development. Regardless of impairments, with the right approach, the child will not be excluded and alienated, but will have a fulfilling social life.

Differentiated education is a modified form of the basic education program, meaning that the same material is covered yet in a different way. Through differentiation, material is broken down in line with the students' needs depending on the difficulties the child needs to overcome in order to effectively learn.

Some teaching support for students:

- Keep your classroom organised
- Remember that each child is an individual and has unique needs
- Give your students opportunities for success and then celebrate those successes
- Create a support network
- Keep things simple and short
- Show, demonstrate and model
- Utilise multisensory learning
- Provide small group of instructions
- Trust, Faith and Perseverance makes all the difference.

How to create a learning environment at home?

Ma...Ma...Da or Maa Baa are mostly the first words we hear from our children as a parent. This gives us immense joy to see our children learning to speak. Learning starts from mother's womb where they are familiarised with the sound of their mother's voice and be able to identify her language. As, children grow they adopt positive attitudes and develop ways to learn new things, be curious, and increase confidence in themselves.

The time spent by the family, communicating and interacting with each other is very important for children's development and wellbeing. A positive learning environment is created when you value participatory teaching and learning and when there is trust and rapport among children and parents.

How to create a learning environment at home?

- Family meal-times play a vital role, no matter how old your child is. Give time and space for family mealtimes to inculcate healthy lifestyle choices, teamwork, sharing, communication and problem-solving skills in children.
- Switch off the television and other electronic devices off, and eat together at a table with an aim to build and renew family bonds. Daily physical activities help your child's development by providing opportunities to move, play, learn and develop skills. It also helps with their mental wellbeing. Encouraging your child to take part in energetic play is important. Remember that it is good for you too.
- Praise and appreciation are equally important in the upbringing children. Focus on your child's effort and progress. Use encouraging and motivating words like,

"You worked really hard on that," or "Writing is hard, but I can see how much you are improving with practice!"

Praise and appreciation will help children pursue new and challenging tasks. Remember, every new skill that children learn, every adventure children go on, every new thing children try, it only makes them a better artist...a better human being.
