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PRIMARY Makar Sankranti Celebrations


























Grade 1 learners honed their ICT skills by doing a projectbased formative assessment to create different types of input and output devices.

Effective Questioning in the Classroom

Asking questions is essential for checking the pupil's understanding and keeping them engaged with the task at hand. It's crucial to the way students receive and process information and it encourages independent and critical thinking. Statistics show that the average teacher asks between 300 and 400 questions per day or 70,000 a year. To have the desired effect, these questions need to be effective, well-considered, and challenging, and these questions are known as *Effective Questions*.

Effective questioning involves using questions in the classroom to open conversations, inspire deeper intellectual thought, and promote student-to-student interaction. Effective questions also focus on making the process enjoyable but informative. Using them in the classroom creates opportunities for students to analyze their own thinking, that of their peers, and their work, which broadens the topic under discussion and makes the model clear, with enhancing their speaking and listening skills.

Using Effective Questioning in the classroom, we can get the audience's attention, interact with them, and put them in the centre. In addressing students / classmates with questions, they can be made to feel engaged no matter the group's size.

Questioning helps us learn, explore the unknown, adapt to change, and makes us more curious to learn. This makes the habit of questioning precious, as in a world today where everything is changing and so much is unknown. And yet, we don't seem to value questioning as much as we should. In the classrooms, it is the answers we reward, whereas questions are just answered. To change this and encourage questioning here are the following points which may help in doing so:


1. **Making it Safe and a Habit**: Asking a question can sometimes be very scary as the one who doesn't know the answer, is scared that his classmates may make fun of him, so doesn't ask. To change this, the teachers must somehow create an environment where questioning becomes a strength; where it is welcomed, encouraged and desired.

2. **Make it Fun**: Questions-only exercises, can add an element of play involved, for example: 'Can you turn that answer into a question'. There are countless ways to infect a "game" element into questioning.

3. Make it Rewarding: We must praise and celebrate the questions that are asked, and help create a path for classmates to get from a question to a meaningful result. A good question can be on the basis of an ongoing project, a report, am original creation of some kind. The point is to show that if one is will to spend on a question, it is leading to something rewarding and worth the time.

Lastly, to stop students worrying about how their answers will be received be others, develop a classroom culture where mistakes are welcome and questioning is encouraged.

Benefits provided under Start-up India

You all must have heard start-ups right? Well just in case you don't know, a start-up is a newly established business.

All the businesses were once a startup. All the starts ups now have a chance to be market leaders. Hence the government desires to increase the number of start-ups. They do this by providing benefits to them, few of them are.

Simple process

The Government of India has launched a mobile app and a website for easy registration for start-ups. Anyone interested in setting up a start-up can fill up a simple form on the website and upload the mentioned documents. The entire process is completely online.

Easy access to Funds

A 10,000 corer rupees (\$13313800) funds is set-up by government to provide funds to the start-ups as Venture Capital.

Tax holiday for 3 Years

Start-ups will be exempted from income tax for 3 years provided they get a certification from Inter-Ministerial Board (IMB).

R & D facilities

Seven new Research Parks will be set up to provide facilities to startups in the R&D sector.

Easy Exit

In case of exit – A start-up can close its business within 90 days from the date of application of winding up.

Meet other entrepreneurs

The government has proposed to hold 2 start-up fests annually both nationally and internationally to enable the various stakeholders of a start-up to meet. This will

It's Time to get back to basics!

How parents can prepare children to come back to school post-covid?

The COVID-19 pandemic struck gravely worldwide eventuating shattered daily lives and sadly, the most affected ones are children. Our child's well-being and safety is extremely important to us. We make sure that we've taken every step possible to ensure that they are safe and secure. While we look forward to welcoming our students, there is a feeling of anxiety and fright in the parents about their safety. Here are some tips for parents to prepare their child as they gear up to return to school:

1. Support and understand them mentally and emotionally. Allow your child to share their thoughts and concerns with siblings, close friends, schoolmates, teachers, and coaches, so there is a supportive community both at home and at school.

2. Try to stay calm and reassuring during the transition—using a calm voice, with a relaxed face and body to let the child know that we would not leave them if the child was not safe and protected.

3. Talk to a healthcare professional if your child's symptoms of anxiety or behavior problems are severe or persistent.

4. Set regular bedtimes and wake-ups. It's best to have a regular wake-up time and bedtime that is the same as the schedule you set when they were attending school, since it can be hard to get back on track, especially if kids get into a late-to-bed, late-to-rise schedule.

5. Face masks should be a priority. They are a proven tool to stop the spread of the virus. The mask should be worn correctly and consistently.

6. Encourage all the children–including the vaccinated ones – to maintain at least 2 meters physical distance from everyone.

7. Make sure they carry a hand sanitizer and an extra mask with them.

8. It is very important for your child to be up-todate on their immunizations including the flu vaccine during the pandemic.

9. being sure of providing our kids with healthy homemade food, so that they stay in good health.

10. be a role-model by staying positive and responsible yourself because children follow your lead and imbibe your emotions.

To sum up, as we might have anticipated that getting back into school mode will be a tedious task for our children. Creating a supportive and nurturing environment for them is the need of the hour. Hearing them out, responding to their feelings and concerns will go a long way through these tough times.
