Our learners shared stories with each other which stimulated their imagination and developed their social skills!






















### Sense of Sight - Nursery

This type of play benefits sensory development in many areas, such as cognition, language, motor skills, creativity, and problem solving.














### Gymnastics Tactics - Nursery








### AB Pattern - Nursery

# Ashoka University Orientation Report

Learners of Grades AS and A Level students attended a comprehensive orientation by the Ashoka University representative. Ma'am started by introducing herself and making the students do an activity to highlight the skills of communication and teamwork which students will learn during the course taken at Ashoka University.

There was a lot of information shared about the freedom to choose subjects of their interest and have a major-minor option too. For advanced levels, there is also a 4th year Post-graduate course. Their courses give an introduction to critical thinking along with many other vast topics and give students the opportunity to explore them during the years spent. Students will also be able to convert their subjects from minor to major and major to advanced major in their 4th year. Ashoka University emphasises on profile building such as passion and talent when it comes to admissions and requires a personalised essay. After students are selected, they conduct an aptitude test and finally, an interview. Scholarships are available and they have 4 intakes annually. Students can choose to stay on campus. They also have 55+ student-led clubs and societies on campus. After graduation, 350+ companies come to hire capable students directly from the university. They also have pre college summer courses in the month of May (YSP) for more information, one could refer to their website.

The orientation was extremely fruitful as many students loved the campus and the course options available.











# Research work on kidney problems - Grade VIII
