
















Ways to Help Students Maximise Their Potential

Educators possess the power to encourage students to develop their own determination to learn and succeed. Extrinsically motivating them could catalyse this process. Establishing positive relationships with them to build on their strengths will surely aid in ensuring an effective instruction. If the relationship is strong, instructional strategies seem to be more effective.

Here are some great ways to gain their trust and learn what is meaningful to

1. Give students an opportunity to show what they value most

Make every learning experience an opportunity for assessing growth. Receiving feedback on their performance and areas of growth helps students feel confident that they can progress in their learning.

2. Ask students what they expect from you and make sure you meet their expectations

When students feel that you have a genuine interest in what you can do to gain their respect, they will be more willing to do what they can to gain yours. Asking for their opinions about what constitutes a good teacher in their eyes, and doing your best to live up to their descriptions, will show students that what they say matters to you. Give the students choices whenever possible

3. Let students choose what they want to learn

7. Give timely feedback

This will help them rather assure them to acknowledge their path and how close or far they are from their set goals.
