Listening Skills in Grade III

In our Grade III classroom, we recently conducted an engaging activity designed to enhance listening skills among students. Recognizing that effective listening is crucial for academic success and interpersonal communication, we aimed to create an interactive and enjoyable experience that would captivate our young learners' attention while fostering their auditory abilities.

Activity - Learners were divided into 2 groups. Group I were of observers and Group 2 were of listeners. Observers were shown an image on the desktop and given a few minutes to observe every detail of that picture. They had to go back to their respective team members of listeners and asked to describe the image. Listeners had to draw and create the image on a sheet by just listening to the description by observers.

Objective - Promote Listening skills, enhance observation and structured thinking.

Reflection - The "Observe & Listen" activity proved to be an effective and enjoyable way to promote listening skills in our Grade III class. We look forward to incorporating similar activities in the future to continue nurturing these essential skills.









Story session: Prep I

Brightening the day of the students with wonderful stories a storytelling session was conducted where life and expression were in abundance. As a learning tool, storytelling can encourage students to explore their unique expressiveness and can heighten a student's ability to communicate thoughts and feelings in an articulate, lucid manner. It helps improve their language skills, instills a love of reading, and stirs their imagination. To encourage the skills of listening and reading, at TSGE in Prep I the facilitators take storytelling sessions daily. It was an interactive session that was thoroughly enjoyed by the learners.

It is important to engage children in a fun and educational lacing activity that enhances fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and concentration. At TSGE each child is provided with a shape, and yarn, and demonstrates how to start threading through one of the holes. Learners explore different ways to lace the yarn through the holes, promoting creativity and problem-solving. Learners then share their finished lacing creations with the group. Discuss their designs and what they enjoyed about the activity.










Show and Tell - Grade II

At TSGE we start them young, and our Prep I learners learn to play carrom. Playing carrom board can help develop all these cognitive and motor skills which are extremely critical for their holistic development.









Story telling - Nursery

An intriguing story time session at TSGE with our learners. Learners are allowed to imagine and stimulate their sense of thought. Our stories for nursery class in English can take many forms, including puppet shows, music, comedy, and poetry. In addition to enjoyment, storytelling has numerous benefits for their literacy and language development. Stories from such a tender age have a lasting effect on their personality development too.

In the nursery class at TSGE, the activity of soaking and squeezing serves as a fun and educational experience designed to engage our young learners in sensory exploration and motor skill development. Soaking and squeezing activities are carefully crafted to stimulate the senses of nursery learners through hands-on engagement with materials like sponges, cloths, or even toys in water. These activities are not just about getting wet; they are structured to foster cognitive, social, and physical development in a playful environment. Throughout the activity, teachers facilitate discussions about what the children observe, reinforcing vocabulary related to the activity (wet, dry, heavy, light, etc.).

This improvement in dexterity is foundational for other activities such as writing, cutting with scissors, and even tying shoelaces. In addition to its developmental benefits, at TSGE we aim to provide a sense of accomplishment and boost their confidence as they see the results of their efforts. Furthermore, this activity was a collaborative experience, promoting social interaction and teamwork while they worked together to create a collective artwork. Overall, paper tearing was more than just a fun pastime; it was a valuable educational tool that laid the groundwork for future artistic and cognitive abilities in our young learners.









Paper Crumbling

Tearing and Crumpling are a great workout for little fingers and one that is important for building fine motor skills in early childhood.

Tearing and Crumpling as an activity is beneficial in many ways. Tearing strengthens the muscles of the fingers and the whole hand. It develops fine motor control which is necessary for learning to write and it improves eye-hand coordination.

To enhance this skill for our Prep II, Paper Crumpling is a simple craft activity that involves paper tearing, crumpling, and pasting paper balls onto a sheet of paper/given template. They enjoyed doing the activity thoroughly!
